

Frequently Asked Questions – For the migration from OHSAS 18001:2007 to ISO 45001:2018

- Q. What is the effective date of ISO 45001:2018?
- A. The effective date of ISO 45001:2018 is 12 March 2018.
- Q. What will happen to OHSAS 18001:2007 after the release of ISO 45001:2018?
- A. OHSAS 18001:2007 will be considered as being "Withdrawn" on 11 March 2021.
- Q. Is there any transition period for migration to ISO 45001:2018?
- A. Starting from 12 March 2018, there will be a three-year period for the organizations certified to OHSAS 18001:2007 to migrate to ISO 45001:2018. During the migration period, organizations can select to have the migration audits in conjunction with scheduled OHSAS 18001 audits (SV or REA) or a special audit. Initial certification audit with respect to ISO 45001:2018 will be required after the expiry of OHSAS 18001:2007 certificate.
- Q. Can organizations submit application for ISO 45001:2018 now?
- A. Yes. Organizations which participate in the pilot run will be the first batch certified clients of ISO 45001:2018. During the pilot run, there may be some adjustments on the scheme settings, but the adjustments should not have critical impacts on the applicants.
- Q. Will nonconformity(ies) be raised against the requirements in OHSAS 18001:2007 or ISO 45001:2018 during the migration audit?
- A. During the migration audit, auditors will raise nonconformities if it is found that either the requirements of OHSAS 18001:2007 or requirements of ISO 45001:2018 are not fulfilled. And our normal nonconformities and corrective action plans handling processes will be followed.
- Q. What are the criteria for maintaining OHSAS 18001:2007 certificate during the migration audit?
- A. The certification to OHSAS 18001:2007 will be maintained if there is no identified major nonconformity raised against the management system standard.
- Q. What are the criteria for granting ISO 45001:2018 certificate?
- A. The decision to issue certification to ISO 45001:2018 will be made once actions in respect of all outstanding major non-conformities have been reviewed, accepted and verified and the corrective action plan for any minor non-conformities have been reviewed and accepted.
