

Frequently Asked Questions – For the conversion from ISO 10002:2014 to ISO 10002:2018

- Q. What is the publication date of ISO 10002:2018?
- A. The publication date of ISO 10002:2018 is 16 July 2018.
- Q. What will happen to ISO 10002:2014 after the release of ISO 10002:2018?
- A. ISO 10002:2014 will be considered as invalid beginning 16 July 2021.
- Q. Is there any transition period for converting to ISO 10002:2018?
- A. There is a three-year period for the organisations certified to ISO 10002:2014 to convert to ISO 10002:2018 with the deadline being no later than 15 July 2021. During the conversion period, organisations can select to have the conversion audits in conjunction with scheduled ISO 10002:2014 audits (SV or REA) or a special audit. Initial certification audit with respect to ISO 10002:2018 will be required after the expiry of ISO 10002:2014 certificate.
- Q. At what time will the Conversion Audit be scheduled?
- A. The conversion audit will be arranged during your routine ISO 10002:2014 surveillance or renewal audits upon request and which will become conversion audits automatically after 1 September 2019.
- Q. What preparation is needed of the organisations for the Conversion audit?
- A. The organisations shall update their relevant system documents, inform the relevant employees of the update and implement the changes.
- Q. Will nonconformity (ies) be raised against the requirements in ISO 10002:2014 or ISO 10002:2018 during the conversion audit?
- A. During the conversion audit, auditors will raise nonconformities if it is found that either the requirements of ISO 10002:2014 or requirements of ISO 10002:2018 are not fulfilled. And our normal nonconformities and corrective action plans handling processes will be followed.
- Q. What are the criteria for granting ISO 10002:2018 certificate?
- A. The decision to issue certification to ISO 10002:2018 will be made once actions in respect of all outstanding major non-conformities have been reviewed, accepted and verified.
